





- Or 1 publication in the field as first author




Level 2

Level 3

- Full training in a recognized psychotherapeutic approach
- Level of the European Certificate in Psychotherapy



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
Level 3 – Psychotherapy competence

Agreement to the rules of each country

Recognized psychotherapeutic approaches:

- Psychodynamic psychotherapy
- Family therapy
- Humanistic therapies: Transactional Analysis, Gestalt therapy, Bioenergy
- Behavioral psychotherapy

Preferably European certificate in Psychotherapy



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Level 4 – Residency program in Psychosomatics

Specific for Germany and Austria

Level 5 – Building a Psychodermatology Competence Center

This center should be lead by an educated and well trained psychodermatologist (being at first a dermatologist)

A psychologist having a Psychodermatology Diploma Level 3

With a close contact with a psychiatrist preferably also educated in psychodermatology (Level 2 or 3)


The appointments should be done in the dermatology department

There should be a adequate time at least 45 minutes for a first appointment and after if necessary

This should be translated in higher tariffs

The referring dermatologist should be invited to participate at the appointment as much as possible (see *An introduction to the assessment and management of psychodermatological disorders Russell Gibson , Penny Williams & Jason Hancock-BJPsych Advances (2020), page 1 of 8 doi: 10.1192/bja.2020.66*)
